Engaging Your Community (EYC) events are geared for single and multi-point parishes in rural and small town settings. Ideally, a pastor and three or four lay leaders will examine their communities and consider ways in which they can serve those unique needs.

- Participants will identify personal and congregational assets they have in place and make plans for using resources to engage their respective communities. One of the themes of the event will be on building and strengthening partnerships as multi-point parishes and individual congregations explore ways to work together for the needs of their communities.
- Many congregations today are concerned about shrinking membership and fewer children and families in worship. There is no "one size fits all" solution; however, congregational leaders will be encouraged as they see new opportunities for engaging their communities and are filled with hope for the future.
